What is a Community Health Worker?

A Community Health Worker (CHW) is an umbrella term. This role is as diverse as the communities, sites, and responsibilities this profession assumes. CHWs focus on improving individual and community health. They forge connections where people live, learn, work, worship, and heal – from the inner city to rural communities.

According to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, the Community Health Worker workforce is projected to grow 14% over the coming decade, 2022 to 2032, which is much faster than the average for all occupations.
